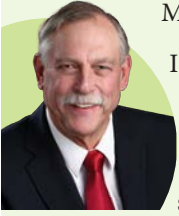

The President's Report



McDonough Supporters, Clubs, and Scholars,

I am honored to be the president of McDonough and am pleased to report on my second year.

Thanks to the hard work of the entire board, this past year has been the Foundation's most successful. I also want to thank all of you for

your continued financial support without which we could not have awarded a record \$225,010 in scholarships to 98 scholars from courses around the state.

Before reviewing the past year, I want to thank our outgoing board member, Jeff Rounsaville, for his outstanding service to McDonough. Jeff has served the Foundation for many years, representing Eastman Golf Links as well as the Upper Valley. His greatest contribution to the Foundation came when, as chair of the scholarship committee, he developed an analytical method for awarding scholarships to those most deserving. He will be sorely missed as a full-time board member, but we are hoping, as an emeritus director, Jeff will continue his support of the Foundation.

On that note I am pleased to announce that Glenn Walton was invited to serve as an emeritus director. Glenn retired from the Board at the end of 2024 after many years of active service to McDonough, including being chair of the scholarship committee and president.

The new year started off with the integration of a new scholarship application platform designed to improve the process for both the Board and McDonough applicants. This new portal exceeded expectations in ease of use for our scholars and streamlined the process for the Foundation. The application deadline for scholarships is May 15.

In late 2023 McDonough established a new endowment fund within its Permanent Fund. The McDonough General Endowment Fund was created with the intent of providing a solid financial basis for our annual giving. Thanks to the generosity of the board, private foundations and donors,

various grants received, and charitable gaming proceeds, in just two years the Foundation has raised over \$343,000 in donations and pledges toward our \$650,000 goal. The money is permanently invested, and the earnings will be utilized toward sustaining the Foundation's scholarship efforts for all eligible applicants for generations to come. A big part of our success of this campaign is the continued support of The Brook and the \$94,912 we received from them this year from five days of charitable gaming proceeds.

This year the Walker Fund was established as a named scholarship as part of our Permanent Fund in the memory of Erwin "Butch" Walker and is designated toward a Stonebridge, Derryfield, or other Hillsborough County scholar.

For the past three years we have run an online auction of donated rounds of golf from golf courses from all over the state. In 2025 this auction generated \$28,000 from 59 donated rounds. New this year were exclusive rounds from four clubs outside New Hampshire: Rhode Island, Congressional, Salem, and Wannamoisett country clubs. Next year's auction will be held from May 15-23. Solicitations are presently being made from clubs and courses. Watch the New Hampshire Golf (NHG) revision emails for the link, and follow us on Instagram and Facebook.

We have made great strides in our ongoing club relations efforts in educating New Hampshire clubs and courses on the importance of their support for the benefit of their employees and scholars.

With the new application process in place the Foundation received 98 completed applications. At our July meeting at Portsmouth Country Club, the Board voted to award \$225,010 in scholarships. This represents the largest scholarship total awarded to date, bringing McDonough's historical giving to more than \$3,700,000 in support of 3,409 scholarships. Our goal for 2026 is to provide at least \$250,000 in scholarships.

We were once again blessed with beautiful weather for our 41st annual golf tournament fundraiser at Bald Peak Colony Club. With a full field, and two of our scholars speaking at the awards ceremony, we raised over \$35,000, all thanks to the support of our many sponsors, donors, players, and Bald Peak. A couple of weeks later, Laconia Country Club held their very successful annual DiFonzo Golf Tournament, raising \$25,000 toward the Thomas L. DiFonzo Scholarship Fund, which is part of our Permanent Fund. Laconia generously donates the course and carts for this annual fundraiser, which helps maximize the significant profit realized from this event.

McDonough's year was capped off at the NHG Hall of Fame Induction Dinner, with the presentation of the Stan Lencki Distinguished Service Award to former McDonough treasurer Dave Wilson.

Over the course of the year we welcomed five new members to the Board of Directors: Rick Senatore from Intervale Country Club, Joe Henley from Lake Sunapee Country Club, Mike Blair from Bretwood Golf Course, Sam Garland from Concord Country Club, and Tina Lyon from Lake Winnepesaukee Golf

Club. I am pleased to have all five "on board" for 2026 and look forward to them helping to advance the Foundation's goal of increased scholarship giving.

In closing, my heartfelt thanks go to all who make McDonough's success possible—individual donors, creators and supporters of named scholarships, club members who give through their clubs, and the scholars we are proud to support. I particularly want to thank all Board members and emeritus board members for their continued efforts in volunteering countless hours and resources year-round to ensure the Foundation can continue its mission. We could not do what we do without your support. And as I mentioned earlier, our scholarship award goal this year is \$250,000, so we are counting on your continued support.

McDonough Scholarships

For the academic year 2025-2026, the Foundation distributed \$225,010 in scholarship grants to 98 eligible applicants, representing 40 golf clubs throughout the state of New Hampshire. Of this year's recipients, 30 entered as freshmen, 20 as sophomores, 29 as juniors, and 19 as seniors. Twenty-five of these scholars are attending nine colleges and universities located in New Hampshire; the 73 remaining are pursuing their degrees at 59 other colleges and universities around the country.

The McDonough Permanent Fund, an endowed fund, allows donors to establish a named scholarship in honor of an individual or in memory of a loved one. These named scholarships provide additional scholarship opportunities annually to the deserving young men and women employed at New Hampshire golf courses, in addition to the McDonough Scholarship grants awarded to every eligible scholar each year. Currently, 28 named scholarships have been permanently endowed and are valued at over \$1,929,944 as of December 31, 2025.

Endowed Scholarships

The McDonough Foundation has a range of permanently endowed scholarships. Each of these awards has been funded by contributions from families or organizations and is named after an individual who was or is deeply committed to golf and the education of New Hampshire youths.

The Bald Peak Colony Club Scholarship

Endowed by ten present and former members of the Colony Club and awarded annually to an employee of the club.

The 2025 recipient is Michael Palmer of Bald Peak Colony Club, who is attending University of New Hampshire.

The Dr. George T. Bottomley Scholarship

Endowed by the Bottomley family and the Fuller Foundation in his memory and awarded annually to an employee of Abenaki Country Club or a club in the New Hampshire seacoast area.

The 2025 recipient is Silas Garland of Abenaki Country Club, who is attending University of New England.

The Dartmouth-Sunapee Upper Valley Scholarship

Endowed by Joseph and Kimberly Henley. This scholarship is awarded annually to a deserving scholar who is attending a four-year college or university, and who has worked in some capacity at a golf course in the general Sunapee-Upper Valley region of New Hampshire.

The 2025 recipient is Morgan Summerton of Newport Golf Club, who is attending Colby Sawyer College.

The Thomas L. DiFonzo Scholarship – 1

Endowed by members of Laconia Country Club and awarded, on an annual basis, to an employee of Laconia Country Club who has shown the financial need and a commitment to his or her ongoing education.

The 2025 recipient is Brody Rollins of Laconia Country Club, who is attending University of Rochester.

The Thomas L. DiFonzo Scholarship – 2

Endowed by members of Laconia Country Club and awarded, on an annual basis, to an employee of Laconia Country Club who has shown the financial need and a commitment to their ongoing education.

The 2025 recipient is Ben Beaudoin of Laconia Country Club, who is attending New England College.

The Eastman Golf Links Scholarship

Endowed by the members of the Eastman Golf Links, the scholarship is awarded annually to a young man or woman employed by the club who has clear financial need. In addition, they have demonstrated high academic achievement and a record of service to their school or community.

The 2025 recipient is Scott Monroe of Eastman Golf Links, who is attending University of Notre Dame.

The Dr. Robert Elliott Memorial Scholarship

Endowed by the New Hampshire Golf Association in his memory and in recognition of his many years of service to the New Hampshire golfing community. The scholarship is awarded annually to the college senior scholar with the highest cumulative grade point average through their previous work.

The 2025 recipient is Tyler Howe of Hoodcroft Country Club, who is attending Southern NH University.

The Bob Erb Scholarship

Endowed in 2021, by Bob's family and friends in recognition of his longtime service as a Board member and past president of the McDonough Foundation. As a born and bred New Hampshire golfer and avid supporter of the McDonough Foundation, he took great pleasure in watching McDonough scholars succeed. This scholarship is awarded annually to a young man or woman of any New Hampshire Golf course who has demonstrated the same love and respect of the game of golf that Bob embodied every time he stepped on the course.

The 2025 recipient is Aidan Conrad of Lake Winnepesaukee Golf Club, who is attending Clark University.

The Robert C. Erb Sr. Scholarship

Endowed by his wife and his son in recognition of his longtime support of the education of New Hampshire youths and their involvement in the game of golf. Awarded annually to a young man or woman who has demonstrated outstanding character and academic achievement.

The 2025 recipient is Liv Arvidson of Lochmere Country Club, who is attending University of New England.

The Alex Gissler Memorial Scholarship

Endowed by the members of Baker Hill Golf Club in his memory and as an outstanding young man and loyal employee, the scholarship is awarded on an annual basis to a young man or woman employed at Baker Hill Golf Club.

The 2025 recipient is Ben Britton of Baker Hill Golf Club, who is attending University of Pittsburgh.



The Arnold and Carol Haynes Family Scholarship

Established and endowed in memory of Arnold and Carol Haynes by their three children, the scholarship is awarded annually to an employee of Bald Peak Colony Club who exhibits high character and meets the eligibility requirements of the McDonough Scholarship Foundation. The scholarship was established in 2021 in recognition of Arnold and Carol Haynes' love of the Bald Peak Colony Club. If no scholarship is awarded in any given year, the annual earnings will be added to the principal balance of the fund.

The 2025 recipient is Sebastian Roberts of Bald Peak Colony Club, who is attending University of New Hampshire.

The High-Clark Scholarship

Established in 2022, this scholarship was endowed by Richard High (a former McDonough scholar and board member), and his late wife of over 40 years, Joyce Clark. Richard and Joyce were both psychologists and for each, education was a life-changing experience. They established this scholarship with the hope it will help do the same for a dedicated and deserving student. The primary intent of this scholarship fund is to assist an eligible applicant who has demonstrated a specific need for financial aid, as determined by the Scholarship Committee. It is available to all McDonough scholars.

The 2025 recipient is Grace Fellows of Colebrook Country Club, who is attending University of New Hampshire.

The Jim Kinhan Directors Excellence Award

Endowed by present and former directors of the McDonough Foundation in memory of Jim Kinhan and awarded on an annual basis to a scholar who has shown academic achievement together with outstanding citizenship and community involvement.

The 2025 recipient is Sam Timmer of Keene Country Club, who is attending the Calvin University.

The Stan Lencki Scholarship

Endowed by the Manchester Country Club membership together with friends of Mr. Lencki in honor of his 50 years of service to the club. The scholarship is awarded annually to a young man or woman who has demonstrated a specific need for financial aid as determined by the Scholarship Committee.

The 2025 recipient is Maggie Fernandes of Apple Hill Golf Course, who is attending University of Mississippi.

The Macomber-Bird Scholarship

Established in 2020, this scholarship was endowed by Grace and Jerry Bird in honor of Grace's parents, George and Ann Macomber, who were longtime members of the Bald Peak Colony Club. The scholarship is awarded annually to an employee of Bald Peak Colony Club who demonstrates outstanding character and service to the club.

The 2025 recipient is Leah Haskins of Bald Peak Colony Club, who is attending Plymouth State University.

The Rick Mahoney Scholarship

Endowed by the McDonough Foundation in honor of Mr. Mahoney's 25-plus years of service as director of the Foundation and chairman of the Scholarship Committee. The scholarship is awarded annually to a young man or woman who is a resident of Nashua, NH, and is employed at a New Hampshire golf course.

The 2025 recipient is Jack Razzaboni of Nashua Country Club, who is attending University of Rhode Island.



The McDonough General Endowment Fund

The McDonough General Endowment Scholarship was created in August of 2023 by the McDonough Board of Directors to create an endowment that benefits all McDonough scholars. The earnings on this fund are distributed by the Board's Scholarship Committee at their discretion as part of the annual scholarship award process. The scholarship is funded primarily by the "Endowing the Future Campaign" and all scholars throughout the state are eligible to receive scholarship awards from this scholarship.

The Mitchell Scholarship

This fund was endowed by the New Hampshire Senior Golfer's Association and originally called the New Hampshire Senior Golf Association Scholarship. At the request of the NHSGA, this scholarship was renamed in December of 2023 to recognize Chuck and Kathi Mitchell's 10-plus years as directors of NHSGA, as well as their work for NH golf in general. This scholarship is awarded annually to an employee of any New Hampshire golf course who has demonstrated academic excellence and a commitment to the game of golf.

The 2025 recipient is Courtney Smith of Portsmouth Country Club, who is attending Virginia Tech.

The Tom Mulkern Scholarship

Endowed by Dan and Amy Mulkern to honor Tommy Mulkern's many decades at the helm of hospitality businesses in New Hampshire, including more than 20 years' operating Wentworth Resort Golf Club in Jackson. Tommy was instrumental in guiding the early careers of numerous young people who went on to become successful golf professionals, golf course superintendents, and restaurateurs. The scholarship is awarded annually to an applicant with financial need, and who is employed at a golf course in the Mount Washington Valley area.

The 2025 recipient is Rylie Walker of North Conway Country Club, who is attending Stanford University

The Pastrick Scholarship

The Pastrick Scholarship was established in 2023 by Scott and Courtney Pastrick, members of Bald Peak Colony Club.

The 2025 recipient is Grace Verde of The Oaks Golf Links, who is attending Stonehill College.



The Walter T. Philippy Scholarship

Endowed in his memory by the Philippy family. Walter was a 48-year veteran of Derryfield Country Club and an advocate for young peoples' involvement in the game of golf. The scholarship is awarded on an annual basis to a deserving candidate employed at Derryfield Country Club or a Manchester, NH, golf club.

The 2025 recipient is Peyton St. John of Derryfield Country Club, who is attending the University of Nevada, Las Vegas.

The David J. Pollini Scholarship

Endowed by the Kingswood Golf Club members and friends of Mr. Pollini in his honor, upon his retirement, of his 39 years of service as head professional at Kingswood Golf Club. The scholarship is awarded annually to an employee of Kingswood Golf Club or an employee of a Lakes Region golf course.

The 2025 recipient is Zach Puga of Owl's Nest Golf Club, who is attending Methodist University.

The Jim Sheerin Scholarship

Endowed by the Abenaki Country Club membership and friends of Mr. Sheerin in honor of his many years of service as head golf professional and director of golf. A longtime supporter and board member of the McDonough Foundation and committed to introducing young people to the game of golf as illustrated by his caddie program and youth golf camps. The scholarship is awarded on an annual basis to a deserving candidate employed at Abenaki Country Club or another Seacoast-area golf course.

The 2025 recipient is Luc Gagnon of Abenaki Country Club, who is attending Campbell University.

The Rich Thibeault Scholarship

Concord Country Club's members and Rich Thibeault's friends have generously contributed toward funding the Rich Thibeault Scholarship Fund upon his retirement as the club's PGA professional in 2021. The fund pays tribute to Rich's many years of service to the members and guests of Concord Country Club, as well as recognizing his loyal support of the McDonough Scholarship Foundation. Rich has designated his named

scholarship to be awarded to a Concord Country Club scholar who has demonstrated specific need for financial aid, as determined by the Scholarship Committee. If no such Concord Country Club candidate exists, the award will be given to another candidate who best meets the criteria for the academic year.

The 2025 recipient is Hannah Verville of Concord Country Club, who is attending Keene State College.

The Erwin "Butch" Walker, Jr. Fund

This scholarship was endowed by the Walker family in 2025 to honor Butch Walker's many years of dedication to the sport of golf, both as a golf coach at Goffstown High School where he taught for many years, as well as his service on the course rating team for the New Hampshire Golf Association. This scholarship will be awarded annually to a deserving candidate who is attending a four-year college or university. The individual should demonstrate financial need and meet eligibility requirements through their employment in any capacity at Stonebridge Country Club, Derryfield Country Club, or a public golf course within Hillsborough County.

As this fund was endowed in September 2025; the first scholarship will be awarded in 2026.

The Wilson-Kurtz Family Scholarship

This scholarship was endowed by David Wilson, a longtime Board member of the McDonough Scholarship Foundation, in memory of his late wife, Marcia Wilson. The scholarship is awarded annually to a young man or woman who works for Cochecho Country Club. The recipient is a scholar entering their sophomore, junior, or senior year of college, with the award based primarily on a combination of academic achievement and demonstrated financial need and an interest in golf considered as a secondary factor.

The 2025 recipient is Taylor Wilson of Cochecho Country Club, who is attending Wheaton College.



The John Wirbal Scholarship

Established by the members of Nashua Country Club in his memory, and in recognition of John Wirbal's 40-plus years of service as head professional. The Wirbal shall be awarded annually to a current employee of Nashua Country Club who has need for financial assistance, has demonstrated outstanding character, and high academic achievement.

The 2025 recipient is Brayden Cole of Nashua Country Club, who is attending Babson College.

The Tracy Wyles Scholarship

This fund was established in 2022 by the membership of Bald Peak Colony Club, in honor of the late wife of club manager Chris Wyles. The intent of the Tracy Wyles scholarship is to provide financial assistance to a deserving student who has demonstrated the desire to pursue a future career in one of the many fields that Tracy was passionate about. The scholarship is open to all McDonough scholars, but the first priority will be given to staff members at Bald Peak Colony Club, followed by other students from the greater New Hampshire Lakes Region.

The 2025 recipient is Nina Morel of Owl's Nest Golf Club, who is attending University of Virginia.

The New England Senior Golfers' Association Scholarship

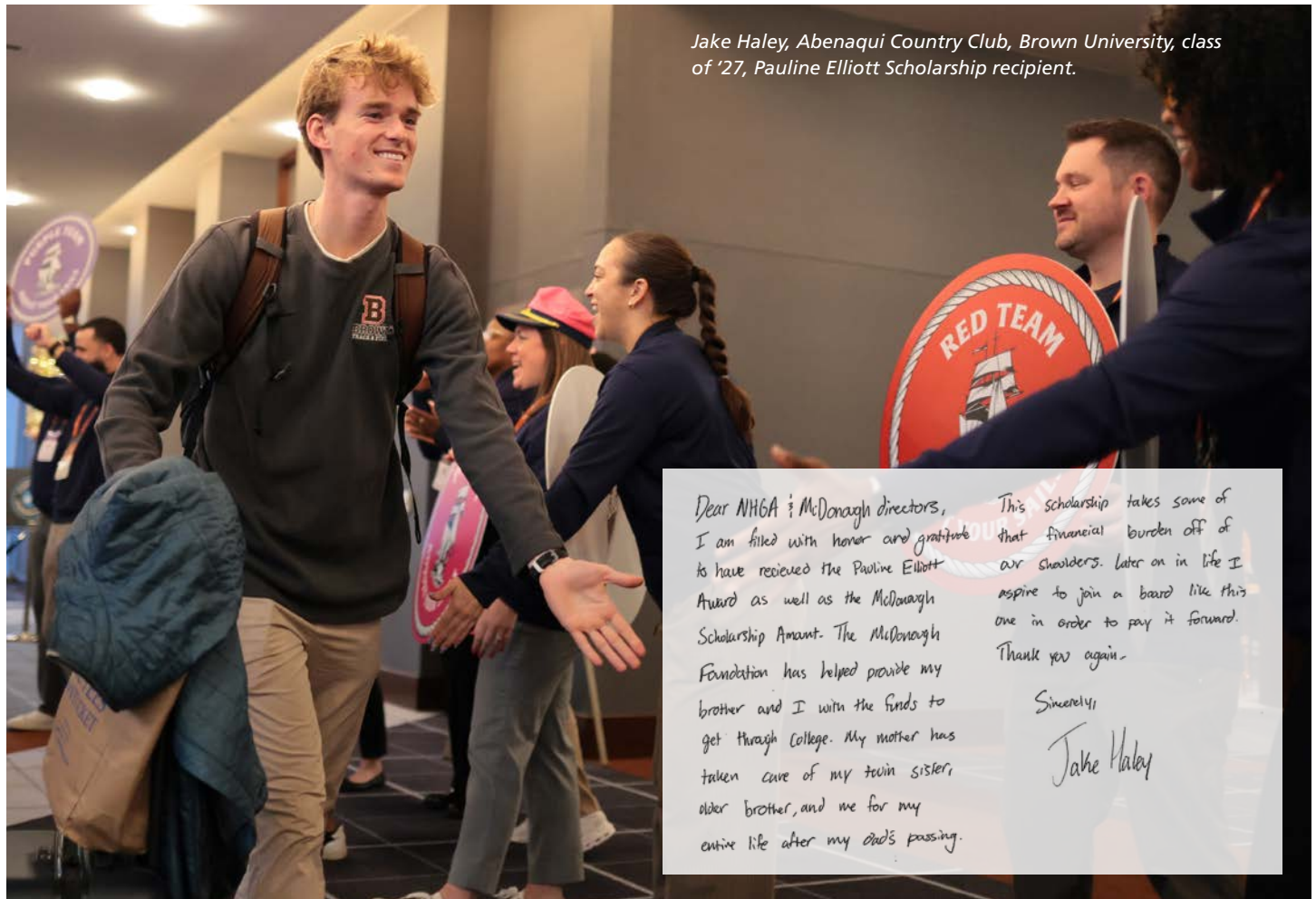

Requirements for McDonough Scholars

Any student employee of a New Hampshire golf course or club is eligible to apply for a scholarship. Candidates should have demonstrated financial need and the promise of academic success. Grants are renewable for up to four years in total, depending upon the continued need for financial aid, annual maintenance of academic standards, and the duration of the scholar's intended program. All candidates must be recommended by the golf club where they have been employed for a minimum of two seasons

For more information about the program, or to submit an application, visit our website at mcdonoughgolf.com. Applications and all required documentation must be received no later than May 15. Interviews with each eligible scholar are held in June and July. Grants are announced in August.

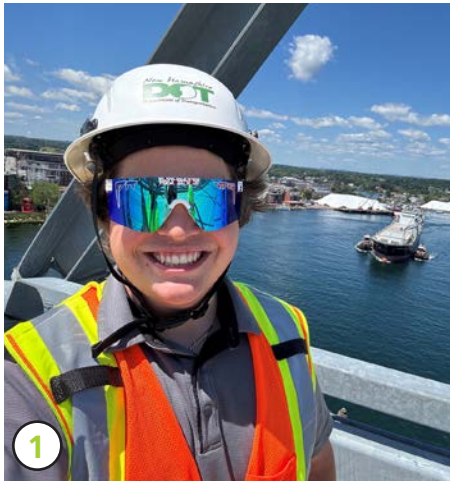


Faces and Places Photo Contest

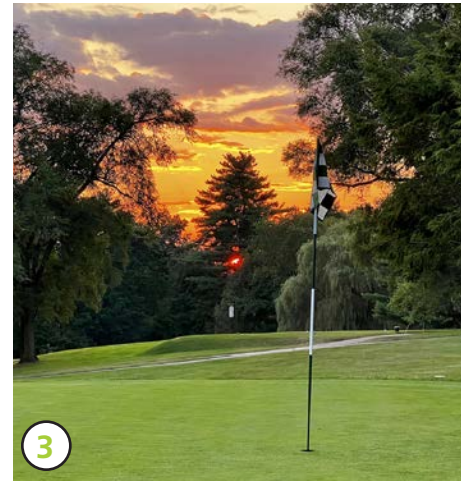

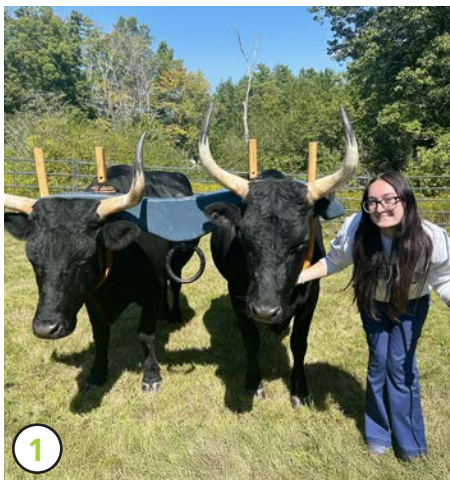

41st Annual McDonough Benefit Golf Tournament

The McDonough Scholarship Foundation's 41st Annual Benefit Golf Tournament was held on September 15, 2025, at Bald Peak Colony Club in Melvin Village, NH. Bald Peak is an enigmatic and grand venue, a place that leaves a lasting impression from the moment one passes through its gates. Set on 1,000 acres of pristine grounds, this exclusive Donald Ross-designed course offers magnificent views of Lake Winnepesaukee and Castle in the Clouds, all framed by rolling hills that define the club's remarkable setting.

The field of 104 players was treated to a first-class experience, beginning with a patio luncheon overlooking the 9th green prior to the tournament's start. Golf professional Paul Tessier and his staff meticulously prepared the course, ensuring players encountered all the challenges Bald Peak is known for – particularly its subtly demanding greens – while providing exceptional support throughout the day.

Following the tournament, participants gathered for a cocktail reception and awards ceremony in the East Lounge, which spilled out onto the rooftop deck on a warm September evening. Two outstanding McDonough scholars were present to share the powerful impact McDonough scholarships have had on their pursuit of college degrees:

Michael Palmer is no stranger to Bald Peak, having worked at the club since 2020. Now a senior at the University of New Hampshire, Michael is pursuing a dual major in computer science and accounting and is a four-year McDonough scholar. He has also been the recipient of various Bald Peak-named scholarships in each of those years. Michael's drive for excellence is reflected in his impressive academic record and the high standards he brings to his work at Bald Peak – qualities that will serve him well as he prepares to graduate this May.

Morgan Summerton of Newport Golf Club returned this year after attending the 2024 tournament to share her remarkable journey. Now in her second year at Colby-Sawyer College, Morgan is majoring in sport management and is an accomplished equestrian who hopes to apply her degree within the professional bull riding and rodeo industry. In addition to her studies, Morgan maintains a demanding schedule that includes weekend work at Newport Golf Club, extensive volunteer service, legislative advocacy for deaf and hard-of-hearing citizens like herself, and participating in women's ski-jumping programs. In recognition of her achievements and leadership, Morgan was selected as the 2025 recipient of the Dartmouth-Sunapee Upper Valley Scholarship.

The Stan Lencki Distinguished Service Award

The Stan Lencki Distinguished Service Award is presented annually by the McDonough Scholarship Foundation to an individual or organization whose efforts and dedication to the mission of the McDonough have been instrumental in its continued growth.

This award is named in memory of Stan Lencki, a long-time head golf professional at the Manchester Country Club who supported the McDonough Scholarship Foundation in countless ways.

The 2025 Stan Lencki Distinguished Service Award was awarded to McDonough Emeritus Board Member David Wilson at the NHGA Dinner of Champions on November 4, 2025. Dave joined the McDonough board in the 90s. While the Foundation had been operating for quite some time, McDonough's resources were not what they are today. Dave served as our treasurer for about 15 years, and under his watchful eye and with his keen ability to manage the Foundation's meager funds, we were always able to increase our scholarship awards from year to year. Sometimes that meant that some checks didn't go out until our September tournament had taken place, but the kids always received their money!

Even though Dave retired from active service to McDonough many years ago, he has continued to be a significant supporter of McDonough, establishing the Wilson-Kurtz Family Scholarship in his late wife Marcia's memory. He remains involved in McDonough as an emeritus director and attends board meetings while in New Hampshire during the summer.

For all his many years of dedication and contributions to McDonough, we were proud to present the 2025 Stan Lencki Distinguished Service Award to David Wilson.

2025 DiFonzo Memorial Scholarship Tournament



The Eighth Annual Thomas L. DiFonzo Memorial Golf Tournament was held on September 22, 2025, at Laconia Country Club. Established in 2018 by Laconia's membership, the DiFonzo Scholarship honors the life and legacy of longtime course superintendent and NH Golf Association Hall of Famer Tom DiFonzo, whose impact on the club—and the people who make it run—continues to be felt years after his passing.

What began as a single annual scholarship for a Laconia scholar has grown into something far more meaningful. Thanks to the generosity, loyalty, and enthusiasm of the Laconia Country Club community, the DiFonzo Fund has expanded well beyond its original vision. At the end of 2025, the DiFonzo Scholarship Fund grew to over \$250,000. This year, two Laconia scholars (Ben Beaudoin and Brody Rollins) were awarded substantial DiFonzo Scholarships, with a third scholarship already planned for 2026.



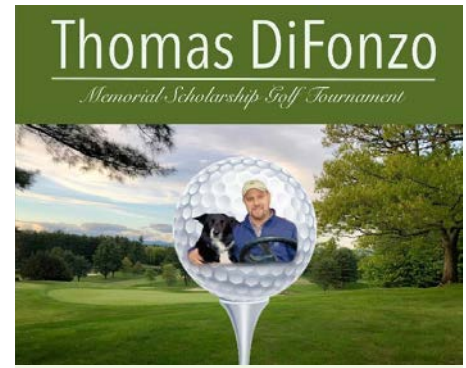
At the heart of this growth is the annual DiFonzo Memorial Tournament, held each September at Laconia Country Club. Frequently Asked Questions

What is the McDonough Scholarship Foundation?

The McDonough Foundation is a volunteer organization whose sole mission is to solicit monies on an annual basis for the purpose of awarding scholarship grants to New Hampshire golf course employees who are attending colleges, universities, and accredited trade schools of their choice at the undergraduate level. The Foundation is a not-for-profit organization. Its Employer Identification Number is 02-6012491, and copies of its 501(c)3 and W-9 forms are available upon request.

Who is qualified to apply for a McDonough Scholarship grant?

Any student employee of a New Hampshire golf course or club may apply. This includes pro shop, grounds, wait, kitchen, and office staff. All first-time candidates must be recommended by the golf club where they are in at least their second year of employment, have demonstrated financial need and the promise of academic success, and be of good character. Once awarded, a McDonough scholarship may be renewed for up to four years, depending upon satisfaction of eligibility criteria and the duration of the scholar's intended degree or program. All scholarship candidates must submit an application annually and be full-time students enrolled in an undergraduate degree up to the bachelor's degree level or accredited trade school program.

The application becomes available on our website in late January. All applications and required supporting documentation must be received no later than 11:59 EDT on May 15 for consideration of a scholarship award for the current year.

The McDonough Foundation is an equal opportunity scholarship program and does not discriminate based on sex, race, color, religion, age, ethnic origin, orientation, gender identity, or any other legally protected status.

How are scholarship recipients chosen?

New applicants and previous recipients are interviewed by a member of the McDonough Board of Directors annually. Scholarship grants are based on the candidate's demonstrated financial need, along with maintenance of a minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA and interview results. Their qualifications are reviewed, and awards are determined based on the criteria set forth by the Board of Directors.

Does the amount donated by a given club have any bearing on the amount awarded to an employee(s)?

In 2025, 26 clubs and associations donated to the Foundation, with recipients representing 40 clubs. Our scholarships are awarded based primarily on financial need; however, working at a donor club as well as a scholar's GPA are factors in determining the amount of final award.

If a scholarship recipient does not return to their employing club, are they still qualified to apply for a scholarship grant for the following academic year?

Yes. Often scholarship recipients will attend summer school or take an internship in their chosen field. These scholars are still qualified to receive McDonough grants for their upcoming academic year.

Book Awards are given to those who left their supporting club to pursue employment elsewhere and not to work at an internship or job relating to the individual's career path or attending summer school.

What is a "Book Award"?

All eligible applicants receive McDonough scholarship money. \$500 Book Awards are given to: a) eligible applicants who are deemed to have no demonstrated financial need for that year based on the information submitted on their application; and b) applicants who left their supporting club to pursue employment elsewhere and not to work at an internship or job relating to the individual's career path.

What is the average total annual awards?

Over the past five years, total annual awards have averaged \$168,098. A total of \$3,713,800 has been awarded since the inception of the Foundation.

What are the Foundation's primary sources of revenue?

In 2025, the Foundation had total operating revenue of \$341,914, of which \$156,424 was generated through New Hampshire golf club contributions. An additional \$185,490 was received from various sources, including: donations from individuals, the New Hampshire Golf Association, the Profile Senior Golfers' Association, the New Hampshire Senior Golfers' Association, and the New England Senior Golfers' Association, together with profits from our Online Auction of golf rounds, and the McDonough Annual Benefit Golf Tournament. In addition, \$73,610 in earnings from the Permanent Fund were included in total operating revenue for the year.

What percent of annual operation revenue goes toward scholarship grants?

In 2025, 84% of our operating revenue (excluding earnings on our permanent fund) went directly toward scholarship grants. The high-payout percentage is made possible by the McDonough Foundation's volunteer-driven structure, with just one paid staff member. Our executive director, who is instrumental in generating annual revenues, is also heavily involved in building our endowment. In 2025, the Foundation received \$259,230 in contributions to our endowed Permanent Fund. Scholarship awards and salary expense are our primary operating expenses with other minor expenses incurred for promotional/marketing efforts (e.g., graphic design and website management, mass-mailing services, and printing expenses).

Frequently Asked Questions

What is the McDonough Permanent Fund?

The McDonough Permanent Fund, currently valued at \$1,929,944, is an endowment fund created in April 2000 to help ensure the continuation of the scholarship program for years to come. To date, 28 named scholarships have been funded by contributions from families or organizations that are deeply committed to golf and the higher education of New Hampshire golf course employees. The annual earnings from these named scholarships, together with unrestricted gifts, is applied to annual scholarship awards. Cambridge Trust Wealth Management is the custodian and investment advisor for the Permanent Fund.

What is the McDonough Heritage Society?

The McDonough Heritage Society is an adjunct to the Permanent Fund, which provides an opportunity for individuals to make bequests to the Foundation as part of their estate planning. Bequests and other planned gifts are important sources of revenue to the Foundation and when received, become part of the permanent Fund or designated as specified by the grantor.

How can I help and/or get involved?

There are many ways. For example, making a financial contribution, volunteering to become the McDonough ambassador at your club, serving as a McDonough liaison within your local business community, or informing friends of the McDonough "mission." You might also consider becoming a member of the McDonough Board.

FAQs are updated early each year and are based on the Foundation's year-end financials.
